Collect:

Holy God, faithful and unchanging: enlarge our minds with the knowledge of your truth, and draw us more deeply into the mystery of your love, that we may truly worship you, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

First Reading: Isaiah 6. 1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. ²Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. ³And one called to another and said: 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory.' 4The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. ⁵And I said: 'Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!' Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. ⁷The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: 'Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out.' 8Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I; send me!'

Psalm: 29 Common Worship set chant

- I Ascribe to the Lord, you 'powers of 'heaven, ◆ ascribe to the 'Lord 'glory and 'strength.
- 2 Ascribe to the Lord the honour ¹ due to his ¹ name; ◆ worship the ¹ Lord in the ¹ beauty of ¹ holiness.
- 3 The voice of the Lord is upon the waters; the God of ¹ glory ¹ thunders; ◆ the Lord is up¹on the ¹ mighty ¹ waters.

- 4 The voice of the Lord is mighty in ¹ oper¹ation; ◆ the voice of the Lord ¹ is a ¹ glorious ¹ voice.
- 5 The voice of the Lord ' breaks the ' cedar trees; ◆ the Lord ' breaks the ' cedars of ' Lebanon;
- 6 He makes Lebanon 'skip like a 'calf ◆ and Sirion 'like a 'young wild 'ox.
- 7 The voice of the Lord splits the flash of lightning; the voice of the Lord ¹ shakes the ¹ wilderness; ◆ the Lord ¹ shakes the ¹ wilderness of ¹ Kadesh.
- 8 The voice of the Lord makes the oak trees writhe and strips the ¹ forests ¹ bare; ◆ in his ¹ temple ¹ all cry, ¹ 'Glory!'
- 9 The Lord sits enthroned a bove the water flood; ♦ the Lord sits enthroned as king for ever more.
- 10 The Lord shall give 'strength to his 'people; ◆ the Lord shall give his 'people the 'blessing of 'peace.

Second Reading: Romans 8. 12-17

¹²So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh— ¹³for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. ¹⁴For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. ¹⁵For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, 'Abba! Father!' ¹⁶it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews.²He came to Jesus by night and said to him, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.' 3 lesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.' 4Nicodemus said to him, 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" 5Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷Do not be astonished that I said to you, "You must be born from above." 8The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.' 9Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?' 10 Jesus answered him, 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? 11'Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. ¹²If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? 13No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. 14And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, 15that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. 16'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. 17'Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.
